Clubgrants Category 3 Infrastructure Grants open Monday 27 June 2022


The July 2022 round of Clubgrants Category 3 Infrastructure Grants opens on Monday 27 June 2022.

The NSW Government offers grants to communities across NSW to support the building, renovation and fitout of community infrastructure. Funding is available for sport and recreation facilities, arts and cultural infrastructure, as well as projects that assist communities with essential infrastructure and disaster readiness.

Flood affected communities will be prioritised in funding decisions for the July 2022 round, in line with priorities for disaster affected communities. Applications open at 9am Monday 27 June 2022 and will close 11:59pm (AEST) Monday 18 July 2022.

The Infrastructure Grants process is competitive. Each year the program receives more applications than can be supported and in some instances partial funding offered. information: may For more www.nsw.gov.au/grants-and-funding/responsiblegambling-grants


