Term 3 P&C meeting was held last Tuesday night. Thank you to all who attended the meeting. There was a lot on the agenda, and we thank everyone who attended for their contributions and patience to get through it all. A reminder to please contact the school if you have anything you wish to discuss with them before bringing it to the P&C unless it is P&C specifically related.

The P&C this year have contributed towards the Young Leaders earlier in the year and have purchased 2 new school marquees valued at \$2282. P&C will be donating \$1,000 dollars towards swimming lessons. \$1,400 will also be donated towards 3-6 excursion (\$100 per child) and \$360 (\$30 per child) for the K-2 excursion. We have also agreed on donating some certified soft fall (bark chips) to go under the monkey bar area to make this a safer place to play. We would like to thank Ben Carn for agreeing to take on the task of painting the outside of the container to get it ready for the P&C mural. P&C funds will also be paying for this. Once these transfers have taken place a total just over \$6500 will have been contributed to the school in some way by P&C. P&C also have contributed \$500 to the Centenary planning. We look forward to a great weekend that the committee has planned.

A staggering \$26 000 was donated by the P&C last year and we still have some great things in the pipeline for 2023. More information to follow in weeks to come.
